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INTRODUCTION

FEP is pleased to provide the 2009-2010 *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary* as a useful reference for drug product selection. The drugs on the *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary* have been reviewed by the FEP Pharmacy and Therapeutics (P&T) Committee and FEP physicians and pharmacists and found appropriate for formulary addition.

"3 Level" refers to three levels of cost sharing by the member. Level 1 is the lowest member copayment share, Level 2 is intermediate, and Level 3 is the highest copayment. Practitioners who select clinically appropriate drugs from Level 1 and Level 2 will be choosing the most cost-effective drugs for their patients who have drug benefits administered through FEP.

All the information in the *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary* is provided as a reference for drug therapy selection. Specific drug selection for an individual patient rests solely with the prescriber.

PREFACE

The formulary is organized by sections, which refer to either a drug class or disease state. Unless exceptions are noted, generally all dosage forms and strengths of the drug cited are included in the formulary.

The *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary* is an open formulary, but FEP may impose restrictions or not reimburse for specific drug products or types of products. For example, drugs and supplies for weight loss may be excluded from the pharmacy benefit. In addition, over-the-counter (**OTC**) products, with the exception of insulin and diabetes monitoring products, are usually not included in the pharmacy benefit. Some OTC products are listed in the formulary for informational purposes only.

The formulary is separated by Levels in the following manner:

Level 1	Level 2	Level 3
Up to \$10.00	Up to \$35.00	50%*

* With a minimum payment of \$45.00 or the cost of the drug

Level 1: Lowest member copayment: all generic drugs, including those on formulary as well as non-formulary generic products.

Level 2: Intermediate member copayment: brand-name products on formulary selected for Level 2, and many branded versions of generics listed in Level 1.

Level 3: Highest member copayment: brand-name products on formulary not selected for Level 2, and all non-formulary brand-name products. In most cases, there will be reasonable alternatives in Level 1 or Level 2 for products found in this highest Level.

Drug products shown in **boldface** type in Level 2 and Level 3 have generic versions. All generic drug products are Level 1.

All drugs added to the formulary are noted in their respective levels of the drug lists throughout this formulary. Drugs reviewed by the FEP Pharmacy and Therapeutics (P&T) Committee and not added to the formulary are designated non-formulary (**NF**) and are listed in Level 3. Also, FEP may designate certain drugs as NF, typically if the cost-effectiveness is less than other drugs with similar usefulness. If generic versions of NF drugs are dispensed, whether listed or not, they are always in Level 1.

PRIOR APPROVAL

Prior approval (**PA**) is required for certain drugs before FEP will cover them. The prescribing physician may request PA by calling 1-877-727-3784. The list of prior approval medications is subject to change. For a current list of medications that require prior approval please see our [Prior Approval](#) web page.

QUANTITY ALLOWANCES

Quantity allowances have been established for some of the medications covered by FEP. Requests for quantity greater than the allowances can be obtained through the Prior Approval program. The prescribing physician may request quantity increases by calling 1-877-727-3784. The list of medications that have quantity allowances is subject to change. PHARMACY AND THERAPEUTICS (P&T) COMMITTEE

The role of the FEP P&T Committee includes evaluation of all medications, and recommendations for addition or deletion of certain medications to the *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary*. The FEP P&T Committee consists of physicians and pharmacists who are not employees or agents of, nor have financial interest in FEP.

PRODUCT SELECTION CRITERIA

The FEP P&T Committee will consider all U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved drugs for inclusion in the formulary. The evaluation includes a literature review; expert opinion may also be sought. Formal reviews are prepared that typically address the following information:

- Safety
- Efficacy
- Comparison studies
- Drug interactions
- Approved indications
- Formulation and Administration
- Adverse effects
- Contraindications
- Pharmacokinetics
- Patient compliance considerations
- Medical outcome and pharmacoeconomic studies

When a new drug is considered for formulary inclusion, an attempt will be made to examine the drug relative to similar drugs currently on formulary. In addition, entire therapeutic classes are periodically reviewed. The class review process may result in deletion or a designation of non-formulary (**NF**) status to drug(s) in a particular therapeutic class, in an effort to continually promote the most clinically useful and cost-effective agents.

Drugs evaluated by the P&T Committee and not added to the formulary receive a non-formulary (**NF**) designation in the *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary*. This designation indicates the P&T Committee's belief that the drug offers no important clinical or cost advantage over comparable formulary drugs, or that there is currently insufficient information to determine its appropriate clinical role, or that questions remain regarding safety and effectiveness. In an open formulary environment, NF drugs are covered under FEP's pharmacy benefit. However, there may be additional costs incurred by the patient to receive a NF medication. Physicians are encouraged to prescribe formulary drugs.

All the information in the *FEP 3 Level Drug Formulary* is provided as a reference for drug therapy selection. The final choice of a specific drug selection for an individual patient rests solely with the prescriber.

FORMULARY PRODUCT DESCRIPTIONS

To assist in understanding which specific strengths and dosage forms are on the formulary, examples are noted below. The general principles shown in the examples can usually be extended to other entries in the book. Any exceptions are noted.

Products on formulary include all strengths and dosage forms of the cited brand-name product.

zolmitriptan

Zomig

Nasal spray, oral tablets, oral disintegrating tablets, and all strengths of Zomig would be included in this listing.

When a strength or dosage form is specified, only the specified strength and dosage form is on formulary. Other strengths/dosage forms of the reference product are not.

ciprofloxacin susp

Cipro Susp

The brand-name suspension formulation is on formulary, but the brand-name tablets are not.

Extended-release and delayed-release products require their own entry.

bupropion ext-rel

Wellbutrin XL

The long-acting product Wellbutrin SR is not on the formulary based upon the Wellbutrin XL entry. Similarly, the brand-name product Wellbutrin immediate-release is not on formulary.

Dosage forms will be consistent with the category and use where listed.

neomycin/polymyxin B/hydrocortisone

Cortisporin

Since Cortisporin is listed only in the OPHTHALMIC section, it is limited to the ophthalmic product only. From this entry, the OTIC product and the topical cream/ointment cannot be assumed to be on the list unless there are entries for these products in the OTIC and DERMATOLOGY sections of the formulary.

GENERIC SUBSTITUTION

Generic substitution is a pharmacy action whereby a generic version is dispensed rather than a prescribed brand-name product. **Boldface** type indicates generic availability. However, not all strengths or dosage forms of the generic name in boldface type may be generically available. In addition, boldface type may indicate that the brand name cited is a generic. Examples of the latter include Levoxyl and Trivora.

One way to reduce out-of-pocket cost is by requesting a generic drug. Generic drugs are usually priced lower than their brand-name equivalents. Generic drugs are:

- Approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for safety and effectiveness, and are manufactured under the same strict standards that apply to brand-name drugs.
- Tested in humans to assure the generic is absorbed into the bloodstream in a similar rate and extent compared to the brand-name drug. Generics may be different from the brand in size, color, and inactive ingredients, but this does not alter their effectiveness or ability to be absorbed just like the brand-name drug.
- Manufactured in the same strength and dosage form as the brand-name drugs.

When a generic drug is substituted for a brand-name drug, you can expect the generic to produce the same clinical effect and safety profile as the brand-name drug.

DRUG EFFICACY STUDY IMPLEMENTATION DRUGS

Drugs first marketed between 1938 and 1962 were approved as safe but required no showing of effectiveness for FDA approval. Beginning in 1962, all new drugs were required to be both safe and effective before they could be marketed. This legislation also applied retroactively to all drugs approved as safe from 1938-1962. The Drug Efficacy Study Implementation (DESI) program was established by the FDA to review the effectiveness of these pre-1962 drugs for their labeled indications, and a determination of fully effective was made for most of these products and they remain in the marketplace. A few DESI products remain classified as "less than fully effective" while awaiting final administrative disposition. Also classified as DESI are many products listed as identical, similar, or related to actual DESI products.
