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INTRODUCTION

Metropolitan Health Plan (MHP) is pleased to provide the MHP Closed Formulary to be used when prescribing for patients covered by the pharmacy plan offered by MHP. **This is a closed formulary and only those drugs listed in this formulary will be covered by MHP.**

The drugs listed in the MHP Closed Formulary have been reviewed and approved by the MHP Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee. The drugs selected for this formulary are clinically-appropriate and cost-effective for patients who have their drug benefit administered through MHP. There may be occasions when an unlisted drug is desired for medical management of a specific patient. In those instances, the unlisted medication may be requested through the Non-Formulary Drug Request Process.

The information contained in the MHP Closed Formulary and its appendices is provided by MHP, solely for the convenience of medical providers. MHP neither warrants nor assures accuracy of such information, nor is it intended to be comprehensive in nature. The MHP Closed Formulary is not intended to be a substitute for the knowledge, expertise, skill and judgment of the medical provider in his or her choice of prescription drugs. All the information in the MHP Closed Formulary is provided as a reference for the drug therapy selection. Specific drug selection for an individual patient rests solely with the prescriber.

MHP neither assumes responsibility for the actions or omissions of any medical provider based upon reliance, in whole or in part, on the information contained herein. The medical provider should consult the drug manufacturer's product literature or standard references for more detailed information.

MHP requires generic/brand copays in some groups, with a monthly out-of-pocket expense maximum. Children under 21, pregnant women, hospice, nursing home and IMC-facility plan members are exempt from copays. Also, all anti-psychotic drugs are exempt from copay. Members may have copays if they have Medicare Part D coverage with another plan.

MHP contracts with CVS Caremark as our pharmacy benefit manager (PBM). Claims are processed through the CVS Caremark system.

PREFACE

The MHP Closed Formulary is organized by sections. Each section is divided by therapeutic drug class primarily defined by mechanism of action. Products are listed by generic name with brand name for reference only. Unless exceptions are noted, generally all applicable dosage forms and strengths of the drug cited are included. Generics should be considered the first line of prescribing.

This formulary covers selected over-the-counter (OTC) products. You are encouraged to prescribe them when appropriate. Some OTCs are noted within the drug lists; a reference list is included in the preface.

PRODUCT SELECTION CRITERIA

The MHP P&T Committee will consider United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved drugs for inclusion on the formulary. The evaluation includes a literature review and expert opinion may also be sought. Formal reviews are prepared which typically address the following information:

- Safety
- Efficacy
- Comparison studies
- Approved indications
- Adverse effects
- Contraindications/Warnings/Precautions
- Pharmacokinetics
- Patient administration/compliance considerations
- Medical outcome and pharmacoeconomic studies

When a new drug is considered for formulary inclusion an attempt will be made to examine the drug relative to similar drugs currently on formulary. In addition, entire therapeutic classes are periodically reviewed. The class review process may result in deletion of one or more drug(s) in a particular therapeutic class in an effort to continually promote the most clinically useful and cost-effective agents.

All the information in the MHP Closed Formulary is provided as a reference for drug therapy selection. Specific drug selection for an individual rests solely with the prescriber.

GENERIC AVAILABILITY

Boldface type of a generic drug name in this book indicates generic availability of that product. However, not all strengths or dosage forms of the generic name in boldface type may be generically available. In some cases, **the brand name listed is a generic drug**. Examples of the latter include Levoxyl and Levora.

GENERIC SUBSTITUTION

Generic substitution is a pharmacy action whereby a generic version is dispensed rather than a prescribed brand-name product. **Boldface** type indicates generic availability. However, not all strengths or dosage forms of the generic name in boldface type may be generically available. In addition, boldface type may indicate that the brand name cited is a generic. Examples of the latter include Levoxyl and Trivora.

One way to reduce out-of-pocket cost is by requesting a generic drug. Generic drugs are usually priced lower than their brand-name equivalents. Generic drugs are:

- Approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for safety and effectiveness, and are manufactured under the same strict standards that apply to brand-name drugs.
- Tested in humans to assure the generic is absorbed into the bloodstream in a similar rate and extent compared to the brand-name drug. Generics may be different from the brand in size, color, and inactive ingredients, but this does not alter their effectiveness or ability to be absorbed just like the brand-name drug.
- Manufactured in the same strength and dosage form as the brand-name drugs.

When a generic drug is substituted for a brand-name drug, you can expect the generic to produce the same clinical effect and safety profile as the brand-name drug.

NON-FORMULARY DRUG REQUEST (MEDICAL EXCEPTION)

If a prescription drug is not listed in the MHP formulary, it is considered non-formulary. If changing to a formulary medication is *not* medically advisable for a member, or if situations arise in which it is *medically* necessary that a non-formulary medication be used, the unlisted medication may be requested through the MHP Non-Formulary Drug Request process. The prescriber may call 1-800-647-0550 to notify MHP of the desire for a non-formulary medication.

You may also complete the Minnesota Uniform Formulary Exception Form located on the MHP website at www.mhp4life.org or at the Minnesota Department of Health's website at www.health.state.mn.us/asa. The completed form will be reviewed by MHP for consideration. If a member has been receiving the prescribed non-formulary drug at the time of the request, a 30-day supply will be covered during the review process. The member and prescriber will be notified of the decision.

PRIOR AUTHORIZATION (PA)

Metropolitan Health Plan requires prior authorization (PA) for certain drugs. The PA requirement is noted in the text with a PA after the drug name. Additions and deletions to the drugs requiring PA are published on the MHP website at www.mhp4life.org.

Drugs requiring PA are not covered unless the request for PA is approved. To request PA, the prescriber should call 1-877-433-7643 to notify CVS Caremark (MHP's PBM) of a PA request.

A representative will contact the prescriber if other information is needed. This and subsequent information will be held confidential (in a locked file) by MHP. If approved, CVS Caremark will change the on-line satellite computer to allow the member to obtain the drug. If the request is not approved, a letter to the member will give the reasons why and the grievance process.

The criteria for use of each drug follows the FDA approved labeled indications and standards of medical practice. These criteria can change based on newly approved indications.

QUANTITY LIMITATIONS

Quantity Limitations (QL) provide for a maximum quantity of drug product that a member may receive per prescription over a specific period of time. The following drugs are subject to QL:

SPECIALTY PLAN DESIGN

Specialty Guideline Management (SGM)

SGM is our utilization management program that helps ensure appropriate utilization for specialty medication based on currently accepted evidence-based medicine guidelines. The utilization management program is available for all therapeutic areas dispensed by our specialty pharmacies. SGM is designed to ensure safety and efficacy while preventing off-guideline utilization. Medications which may be included in the SGM program are identified in the document as “SP” for your reference.

PLAN DESIGN

The document represents a closed formulary plan design. The medications listed on the document are covered by the plan as represented. Certain medications on the list are covered if utilization management criteria are met (i.e. Step Therapy, Prior Authorization, Quantity Limits, etc); requests for use of such medications outside of their listed criteria will be reviewed for medical necessity. If a medication is not listed on the document, a formulary exception may be requested for coverage. Medical necessity or formulary exception requests will be reviewed based on drug-specific prior authorization criteria or standard non-formulary prescription request criteria.
